Sir George Booth, 1st Bt.

Sir George Booth, 1st Bt. was born on 20 October 1566.¹ He was the son of Sir William Booth and Elizabeth Warburton.¹ He married, firstly, Jane Carrington, daughter of John Carrington and Ellen Holford, on 18 February 1577/78.¹ He married, secondly, Katharine Anderson, daughter of Sir Edmund Anderson and Magdalen Smith, circa 1590.¹ He died on 24 October 1652 at age 86.¹ He was buried on 18 November 1652 at Bowden, Cheshire, England.¹ He died intestate and his estate was administered on 28 February 1655/56.¹

Sir George Booth, 1st Bt. was invested as a Knight in 1599.¹ He was created 1st Baronet Booth, of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [England] on 22 May 1611.¹ He held the office of Sheriff of Lancashire.² He held the office of Sheriff of Cheshire.²

Sir George Booth, 1st Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey

Sir George Booth, 1st Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey was born on 18 December 1622.³ He was the son of William Booth and Vere Egerton.³ He married, firstly, Lady Catharine Clinton, daughter of Sir Theophilus Clinton, 4th Earl of Lincoln and Bridget Fiennes, on 30 November 1639 at St. Mary's Church, Colechurch, London, England.³ He married, secondly, Lady Elizabeth Grey, daughter of Henry Grey, 1st Earl of Stamford and Lady Anne Cecil, circa 14 December 1644.³ He died on 8 August 1684 at age 61.³

Sir George Booth, 1st Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey held the office of Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Cheshire between March 1646 and 1648.³ He succeeded to the title of 2nd Baronet Booth, of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1611] on 24 October 1652.³ He held the office of Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Cheshire between 1654 and 1656.³ He held the office of Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Cheshire between 1656 and 1658.³ He held the office of Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Lancashire in 1659.³ He was Commander-in-Chief of the the forces in Cheshire, Lancashire and North Wales, for the King.³ He held the office of Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Cheshire in 1660.³ In 1661 He was imprisoned by the Parliamentarians in the Tower of London.³ He was created 1st Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [England] on 20 April 1661.³

Sir Henry Booth, 1st Earl of Warrington was born on 13 January 1652.¹ He was the son of Sir George Booth, 1st Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey and Lady Elizabeth Grey.¹ He married Mary Langham, daughter of Sir James Langham, Bt..³ He died on 2 January 1693/94 at age 41.¹

Sir Henry Booth, 1st Earl of Warrington succeeded to the title of 2nd Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1661] on 8 August 1684.¹ He succeeded to the title of 3rd Baronet Booth, of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1611] on 8 August 1684.¹ He was created 1st Earl of Warrington, co. Lancaster [England] on 19 April 1690.¹ He had three other sons.³

Sir George Booth, 2nd Earl of Warrington

Sir George Booth, 2nd Earl of Warrington was born on 2 May 1675.¹ He was the son of Sir Henry Booth, 1st Earl of Warrington and Mary Langham.^{1,2} He married Mary Oldbury, daughter of John Oldbury.² He died on 2 August 1758 at age 83, without male issue.¹

Sir George Booth, 2nd Earl of Warrington was styled as Lord Delamer between 1690 and 1694.¹ He succeeded to the title of 2nd Earl of Warrington, co. Lancaster [E., 1690] on 2 January 1694.¹ He succeeded to the title of 4th Baronet Booth, of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1611] on 2 January 1693/94.¹ He succeeded to the title of 3rd Baron Delamer of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1661] on 2 January 1693/94.¹

On his death, the Earldom of Warrington became extinct.¹

Rev. Sir George Booth, 6th Bt. was a chaplain, to his cousin, the 4th Baron Delamer.¹ He was the Rector in 1758 at Ashton-under-Lyne, Lancashire, England.¹ He succeeded to the title of 6th Baronet Booth, of Dunham Massey, co. Chester [E., 1611] on 9 January 1770.¹

On his death, his Baronetcy became extinct.¹
